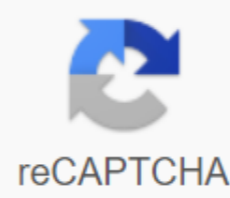

His work included many of the most popular children's books of all time, selling more than 600 million copies and being translated into more than 20 languages at the time of his death. Read Across America Day, also known as Dr Seuss Day, is an annual observation in the US inaugurated by the NEA (National Education Association). It was held on the nearest school day to March 2, Dr Seuss's birthday. Theodor Seuss Geisel is an American artist, book publisher, animator, poet, political cartoonist and author. She is best known for writing more than 60 children's books. The NEA is an American professional interest organization as well as a labor union headquartered in Washington, DC. The organization represents public school teachers plus other support workers, staff and faculty at universities and colleges, retired educators and students preparing to become teachers. The NEA launched Read Across America, a reading initiative that began in 1997, to encourage children to read more books and also get them excited about reading. On March 2, 1998, the first Read Across America Day was celebrated; since then, it has been held every year. This holiday mainly focuses on motivating children to read because it improves their performance at school. Today, hospitals, bookstores, community centers, churches, libraries and schools host many events. Members of the National Education Association and a total of 50 national associations and organizations support Read Across America Day. The National Education Association provides a variety of resource materials for people who want to celebrate the holiday in a unique way. This day of motivation and awareness calls on all children and adolescents in every community across the United States to celebrate reading. It encourages them to read wherever they are. Great ways to inspire reading in kids include: Save books wherever you spend your time. Put it in the car, in every room of the house and tuck it in your backpack and wallet. Make them accessible. Frequent visits to the library. Knowing how to use the library and learning the benefits of libraries fosters a love of reading as well as genuine respect for library services. Caught reading. Children mimic what they see adults around them doing. Whether they see you reading magazines, newspapers or novels, let them know reading is a cool thing to do. Read for your kids. No matter their age, read aloud their vocabulary and language skills. It also opens up opportunities for discussion. Have your kids read for you, too. You never know what you are Learn!
